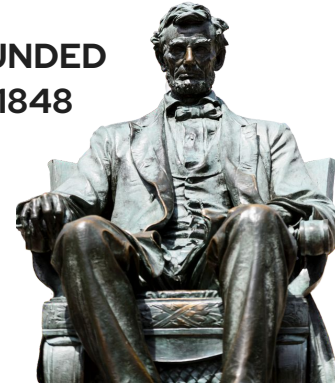

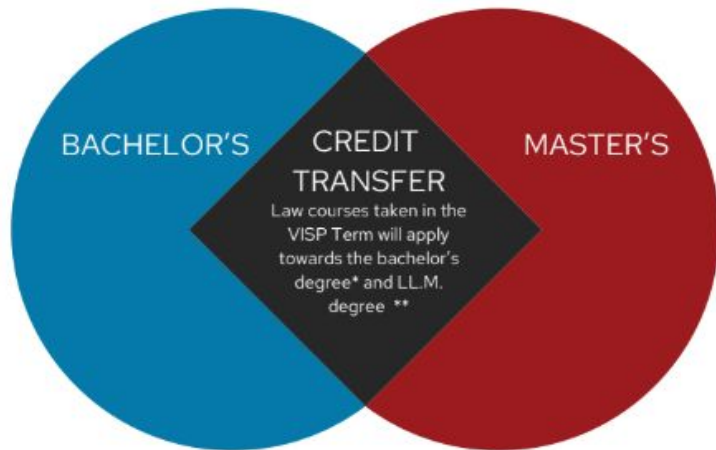

VISP Term + LL.M. Program



*The home institution will determine which course credits earned by the student registered at UW-Madison will be transferable to the home institution and used toward the completion of the home institution's baccalaureate degree.

** Up to 11 credits will transfer to the LL.M. Program.

- For qualified undergraduate students to attend law courses at UW-Madison as non-degree Visiting International Student Program (VISP) students for one semester of study.
- Law courses taken in the VISP Term will apply towards the bachelor's degree and LL.M. degree
- The LL.M. degree can be completed in one additional semester under the VISP Term + LL.M. Program (24 credits)



VISP Term

VISP Law thematic track program

- Have full access to all academic and student support services, such as libraries, computer labs, clubs, and sports facilities
- Receive student support from the VISP advisors. Participate in VISP sponsored social and cultural events each month.

Past events include Badger sporting events, NBA games, guided museum tours, painting parties, restaurant meetups, bowling, and more.

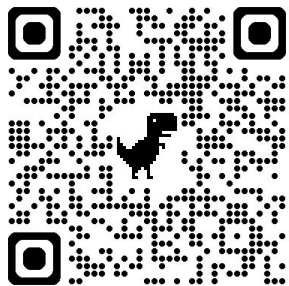
